He's also a Past Prior of South Dakota Priory KYCH and is a past officer in the Red Cross of Constantine, and the Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests.

Perry and his wife, Dolores, have been in retail sales, owning and managing Andersons, Inc., a small retail clothing chain in South Dakota.

Perry is well known in South Dakota and elsewhere for his activities in business, church and community as well as in Masonry. REPORT OF THE GENERAL GRAND MASTER PERRY B. ANDERSON

42nd Triennial Rapid City South Dakota
October 3rd 2005

Welcome Companions! Welcome to this our 42nd Triennial of the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons International. You honor the General Grand Council and its officers by your presence. We are especially happy that so many of you chose to be with us. A special welcome to the distinguished visitors.

Necrology

You will hear the report of the Necrology committee. We are saddened by the loss of so many members by the grim reaper, but know that this is God's plan and we accept it. The General Grand Council line was broken by the loss of Don Gross. Don was a very hard worker, and was missed so much. We still miss him very much, as he was so close to all of us. Our Grand Chaplain will give a Necrology report.

Awards

The General Grand Council, recognizing the need for a way to reward our Ladies, has developed a new award called "The Lady of the Council". It was developed as a way to recognize the Ladies for their dedication and service to their Councils and Cryptic Masonry. This award is an attractive pin accompanied with a beautiful numbered certificate from the General Grand Council. The award is available thru the General Grand Recorders office to be presented at an appropriate time and place to be determined by the purchaser. The recipients name will be recorded in the General Grand Council Proceedings as a permanent record.

The General Grand Council continues to provide and present the "Cryptic Mason of the Year" award in each of our member jurisdictions. This medal is awarded to one member in each jurisdiction that has distinguished himself in Council work. Officers in the advancing line or PMIGM are not eligible to receive this award. The Youth Leadership award is presented to a person (male or female) who has done outstanding work with our youth.

Awards presented at the triennial sessions are, The Mordhurst, the Columbian, and the Silver Medal of Honor. The Mordhurst is for 15 years as a Grand Recorder. The Columbian is for distinguished service to Cryptic Masonry. One is awarded in each region once every three years and 3 may be awarded at large. These are recommended by the Regional Deputies and then awarded by the vote of the Elected Officers of General Grand Council.

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The Silver Medal of Honor will be awarded at the banquet Monday night. This medal is awarded to a Cryptic Mason who has achieved fame in his chosen field, and at the same time made contributions to Masonry. One medal is awarded each triennium.

Youth

The General Grand Council continues to support the Youths organizations. These organizations need you and your money to support them. Adult leadership and attendance is probably more important than you money. Your presence and encouragement are probably the greatest contribution you can make.

Thank You For The Money Appeal

Being unable to find the money in our budget to finance the necessary educational materials needed for our Regional Conferences, we decided to ask the membership to help us. A letter was sent to the permanent members of the General Grand Council, and the results were great. Help us you did!! The contributions were nearly \$6,000.00. This money was used to put "how to" books in our Conference packets. We cannot thank you enough for your generous support. We urge everyone that has these materials to read them and then pass them on to our future leaders. Please do this with all your educational materials.

Regional Conferences

One of our goals was to increase the value of our York Rite Regional Conferences. We felt they should be made worth the time and expense required to attend. We feel we have accomplished much in this respect. The three York Rite bodies have been working together better than I have ever seen it in my last 18 years of experience. The results are obvious. I cannot say enough about the spirit of cooperation and unity that now prevails in our beloved York Rite. The spirit is also obvious in each jurisdiction. Our hope and prayer is that it will continue. This is as Masonry should be.

International York Rite Council

This Council of the elected officers of the three York Rite bodies was established in 1965, for the purpose of working on problems common to each body. In 1990 it was voted that the York Rite Council not meet until such time as they could get along together. We have finally got back together, and are making strides in Unity of the three bodies. There is talk of York Rite Sovereign College hosting this meeting. I have talked with the present heads of the bodies and they are in agreement that it would be a good way to keep the Council in existence. I am for this 100%. The College could be the glue that will hold all the York Rite together in Unity.

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Charters and Dispensations

We have been blessed with a top-notch committee for Charters and Dispensations. The Chairman Bud Himes has done a super job in his research to see that we recognize the correct Councils. He has made several worthwhile and productive visits to get new Councils chartered.

I want to point out the progress made in Brazil. They have done a remarkable job. In about a years time they have 400 members. When we visited in June, they had 400 people in a room when we presented them with new 4 new Charters. They applied for 2 more charters at that time. The next day we witnessed the Super Excellent degree conferred on 294 members. The greatest part of all this was to see 400 Companions bubbling with enthusiasm and brotherly love. What a beautiful sight to see. We can expect great things from Brazil.

Coins

Early in our Triennial it was decided that we would have a coin struck to raise money for the CMMRF. It was decided that since we had no funds to support the George Washington Masonic National Memorial, we would use the same coin to help them financially. We also offered our International network that we have in place, to help them promote the Memorial. The coin is a very nice collector's coin. They are sold for \$10.00 each. One dollar of each sale is donated to the Memorial and the remainder goes to our CMMRF.

Our officers and Regional Deputies were provided with a kit containing promotional materials, a video, and a PowerPoint presentation, which enabled them to make the Memorial more visible.

Joe Vale has handled the distribution of the coins and the collection of the monies. They are out on consignment. The total results will be reported when the final coins and money are returned. Thank you so much Joe Vale for the time and efforts you have put into this worthwhile project. It was what I call a Win - Win - Win project. The CMMRF won, the GWMNM won and the General Grand Council and all its members won.

Visitations

I do not intend to bore you with the individual visits I have made. In our travels we have visited every jurisdiction in the United States. One thing you learn fast is that you can only be in one place at a time.

I have felt it very important to attend the Regional Conferences. This is a way to meet and be with the leaders, future leaders and the past leaders of several jurisdictions at the same time. It is also much easier to communicate with them when they are not busy with their own Sessions.

We have been privileged to visit the appendant bodies of Masonry where the office of the General Grand Council was afforded great respect. In fact, we have been received in a

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manner befitting the office. The warm feelings and sincerity have always been there, and we thank everyone responsible for this.

The sincere friends we have made as we travel are the wages we get for doing the travel.

Finances

You will receive a report from the Finance Committee, so I will not dwell on finances. I do however want to say that we do not at the present time have many problems. We have stayed below our budget. I want to mention and thank the officers that travel and work so hard for the General Grand Council and receive so little in remuneration for what they do. We thank you for all you contribute as a labor of love to the General Grand Council.

Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation

There will also be a report of the CMMRF in your preprinted reports. I do want to add to that and also to thank all those who have worked so hard to keep the contributions coming. In 1987 our contributions to the University for Research was \$24,000.00. Today it is about \$250,000.00 to \$300,000.00. This becomes more remarkable when we consider the loss of membership in these past years. Our contributions provide a base for the University to acquire many more needed funds for research in Vascular Biology. The UI also receives part of the royalties from Dr. March's patents.

While visiting California, I had the pleasure of receiving a very large check for \$150,420.00. Part of this was a bequest. We thank California for their dedication and hard work.

At our board meeting in Indianapolis in August of 2004 the board voted to set up an endowment with \$1,500,000.00 of the funds assets. It is set up so we can only use the interest from this money for research. This will insure us the ability to guarantee an income every year, which will allow us to help fund the research regardless of the amount of our contributions. Our thinking was that we should do this because of our shrinking membership. In 1986 our membership numbered 201,257 in 2002 it was down to 121,700. You can be very proud of the contributions you are making to CMMRF. Fewer members are contributing more. This is remarkable. Thank you for your dedication and continued service to a very worthwhile cause.

State of the Rite

Our theme for the triennial has been "The Best Days of Masonry are yet to come." We still believe this. Our goal was to make this happen by putting the Masonry back into the Masons. While we have not completely accomplished our goal we do think we have made a difference. Many positive things are happening in all of Masonry. Many lodges

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are coming to life and growing. Young men seem to be looking for and finding, what we have and what we stand for. It is essential that we all keep working in our lodges and become roll models for these young men. The epitome of stupidity is to think that we can grow our other Rites with out a Blue Lodge base. We must also keep in mind that if we are to get these new lodge members into the York Rite, we must attend our Blue Lodges and rub shoulders with the members, get to be their friends. Things are looking up but what Freemasonry is tomorrow will depend on what you do today. You are the Masonic leaders and it is up to you.

Recommendations

I would first recommend that the General Grand Council and its officers and members continue to support our newly elected General Grand Master Bud Himes (and his officers) in all his worthwhile endeavors with the same enthusiasm and zeal you have shown to me and my officers.

I would also recommend that the General Grand Recorders office develop a database of the membership of the member Grand Councils. Our means of communication is very limited without this. The only contact we have is with the elected Grand Officers. With the computer technology as it is today, this can very easily be done.

I recommend that we take part in the York Rite Sovereign College program to sponsor the York Rite Council. This should guarantee a continuance of this Council, which is very important to the Unity of the York Rite.

Conclusion

First I want to extend and express my appreciation to all the many, many Brothers and Sisters that have been so helpful in all our endeavors. I will not single out individuals as there are so many of you, I am sure I would leave someone out. The Officers, committee members and every one who was asked to help all did a great job. Thank you so much.

Thank you for allowing us to serve you in the General Grand Council. We have spent 3 years as a Regional Deputy General Grand Master, 3 years as an appointed General Grand Officer and 9 years as an elected officer. This is a long time but it has gone by quickly. These years have been an experience that is unparalleled. They have been the greatest years of our lives. We have made a long list of friends, the truest and most sincere friends that could ever be. Thank you for your friendship fun and fellowship, and your continued service. When we are with you "The best days of Masonry" are here.

I want to thank the 2002 – 2005 officers for all they have done. Your labors of love are really appreciated. We are aware of the free time and money you give for the good of Masonry, and we love you for it.

A very special Thanks to our Triennial Committee. Chairman Don Salmon and his wife Dell. General Grand Marshal Carl Pengra and his wife Carol. They have handled all the

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registration. Housing Chairman Lowell Holmgren and his wife Dee. And also a big thank you to the three lovely Ladies that chaired the General Grand Hospitality room. Ellen Geib, Martha Anderson and Joyce Olson.

And thanks to each and every one of you for your presence and all you have done for the betterment of Masonry. It is truly appreciated.

I could never be able to express my appreciation to my wife Dee, for all she has done and continues to do for me. We have been married for 54 ½ very good years. I want you all to know that I love her and also love all of you and I love Masonry and all it stands for. It is my hope that we will be able to continue our service to Masonry in general and to Cryptic Masonry in particular as time goes by.

REPORT OF THE **DEPUTY GENERAL GRAND MASTER** **MAURICE C. "BUD" HIMES**

These past three years have the busiest, most interesting, and enlightening period of my Masonic career. I have been able to visit nearly all of the member jurisdictions for their Annual Assemblies during this Triennium, and those we have not been able to make are already on my schedule for the coming year. There are so many jurisdictions that meet on the same dates that it is necessary to chose one over the other. Unfortunately, severe weather has also played a major role in our travels the last two years.

I was privileged to travel to Romania in 2003 to deliver the Charters for several Cryptic Councils and their Grand Council. With the assistance of the European Regional Deputy General Grand Master, we installed the officers of the Grand Council. Their enthusiasm and desire to bring the York Rite into Eastern Europe, can't be matched. I have

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continued to work with them very closely since that visit and have asked them to host a conference in the summer of 2006 to plan for the establishment of an organization that will provide assistance and guidance that those countries emerging once again into Masonic Light have the opportunity to join with us through common ritual, procedures, and membership goals. With more than forty countries, some with a long Masonic history, experiencing once again personal freedoms and economic stability, the potential for membership is significant.

I also had the opportunity to travel to Brazil in June last 2004, to carry dispensations and install officers, and I am proud to say that since then Cryptic Masonry has virtually exploded in Brazil. I have been honored to have worked very closely with them translating our ritual into Portuguese, and instructing several of their most accomplished ritualists in the signs and floor work.

During our second visit to Brazil in June 2005, in the company of the General Grand Master, the General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, and the General Grand Captain of the Guard, and their wives, we attended as guests of honor at the conferring of the Super Excellent Degree on nearly four hundred candidates, including seven Grand Masters of Grand Lodges in Brazil. They presently have fourteen Cryptic Councils in Brazil, and either have or soon will, apply for a Dispensation to form a Grand Council of Cryptic Masons. I have seen their work in all the Cryptic Degrees, and see no reason why they should not receive our favorable consideration.

Other Central and South American countries are presently seeking information on the process of establishing the York Rite of Masonry, and with the nearly two hundred thousand Masons in Brazil alone, the potential for membership is tremendous.

The General Ground Council of Cryptic Masons, International is becoming a truly international organization, and I hope to continue this process as long as possible. Brazil has a long and enduring Masonic tradition, where like our country, their liberators and founding fathers were almost universally Masons. And many of the emerging countries are relying heavily on government and business leaders, who are nearly universally Masons, to bring their countries back from more than seventy years of economic darkness, and restore individual freedoms to them. To wear a Masonic emblem in public in some of the Eastern European countries is to be treated with a deference and respect. It is a humbling experience, but also one that makes you very proud to be a member of this great fraternity.

Or anyone needing to turn in contributions for the sale of the coins, see me.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL GRAND TREASURER MELBURN C. "BUD" BARNES

To the Officers and members of the General Grand Council:

I have been well pleased to be elected General Grand Treasurer, and to serve this General Grand Council. As a part of my report, I refer you to the Balance Sheet, Income Statement, and Budget Analysis which have been distributed to you. This is an interim report as the current accounting period will not close until October 31, 2005. Further receipts and expenses will be expected to be posted and will amend this preliminary report.

Investment income was lower than projected due to low interest rates. Continued decline in membership has caused Per Capita income to be below the budgeted amounts as well. While income was well below the projected amounts, the expenses are well below the budgeted amounts as well. It would seem that we should have the ability and inclination to generate additional income without asking our members for money, either as per capita or otherwise. In lieu of a significant per capita increase, alternate streams of income must be considered.

Our report is a consolidated report of all accounts of the General Grand Council. This gives you an immediate and complete financial picture of the General Grand Council. The Treasurer's funds and the Recorder's funds represent different functions of the General Grand Council. In the past my predecessors in office have reported the General Fund separate from the other accounts maintained by the Recorder, and only provided a tabular listing of account balances.

The financial records are available for the review of any member by prior notice, and at any reasonable time.

I appreciate the assistance of the General Grand Recorder, Ronald Fullerlove, in the management of these funds. His investment experience is a proven asset in the control of our funds. Full and complete reports will be included in the final proceedings of this Triennium.

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REPORT OF THE **GENERAL GRAND RECORDER** **RONALD E. FULLERLOVE**

I am pleased to present my report as your General Grand Recorder.

Membership: The General Grand Council now holds affiliation with 52 Grand Councils. During this Triennium we were happy to present Grand Charters to Romania and France, and were most happy to issue Letters of Dispensation to form Councils in Brazil.

We have had additional inquiries from Mexico, Paraguay, Bulgaria, and Serbia-Montenegro.

Only thirty-seven Grand Councils have submitted their annual reports for 2005, and eight Grand Councils are delinquent in their reports for 2004. Seven of these are foreign Grand Councils.

At the end of 2002, our membership stood at 115, 079. To project a loss for the entire triennium, we will have lost an additional 16,400 members. We lost 14,679 in the 1999 – 2002 triennium. We compare this to a loss of 11,900 in the Triennium ending in 1999, and to a loss of 22,870 for the Triennium ended in 1996, and 18,087 in the previous triennium. This Triennium alone we have lost over 14% of our members from 2002.

Our membership committee and officers must work with the other Masonic Bodies.

While it is difficult to communicate with our foreign jurisdictions, closer contact and affiliation needs to be maintained with our foreign Grand Councils. It is difficult at times to overcome the differences in foreign relations and language. But if we are truly to be an international organization, and spread the word of Cryptic Masonry, then this is a difficult task that must be borne. Cultivating a favorable relationship and climate with all of our foreign Councils is worthy of pursuit. It would appear that our foreign jurisdictions of France, Romania and Brazil show the greatest promise for membership growth.

The Domestic Grand Councils continue to demand most of the time and General Grand Council resources of your General Grand Council.

The funds maintained by the General Grand Recorder are included in the reports of the General Grand Treasurer as a part of the consolidated balance sheet. These accounts are administrative in nature, such as accounts for Ritual, Film, Cryptic Freemason Magazine, and for the payment of foreign body per capita dues.

The Cryptic Freemason continues to grow in circulation. We have continued to reduce the cost of the magazine. The mail labels are now bar-coded to reduce the postage cost.

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North Dakota is to be congratulated as they are purchasing a subscription for their entire membership. They are the only Jurisdiction doing so. We have the capacity to add a four page supplement, at nominal cost, for any Jurisdiction wishing to have a quarterly newsletter to their membership.

Our new editor, William Bissey, has struggled in search of appropriate material to be published. I appeal to all our Companions to assist him new and meaningful material.

My thanks goes to Bud Barnes for his assistance in the financial matters of this Office. He was always there when I needed his counsel and advise.

It has been a pleasure serving as your Recorder, and working with General Grand Master Perry Anderson.

Our office stands ready to assist in any manner possible. I look forward to the coming Triennium, working with our new General Grand Master and his officers, and to continue to be of service to the Craft.

REPORT OF THE NORTHEAST REGIONAL DEPUTY PHILIP A. TILSON

It has been my pleasure to serve in this position for the past three years. In most of the Region, Cryptic Masonry is very much alive. This comment is based on personal observations, and includes those Jurisdictions that are not members of the General Grand Council.

The Northeast Region stretches from Maine to the District of Columbia. From border to border there are about 3500 Cryptic Masons. When I accepted the responsibilities of

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Regional Deputy, I set a goal to bring at least one of the non-member Jurisdictions into the General Grand body. Unfortunately, I failed on this 'promise'. However, as a mitigating fact, each of them has participated in the Northeast Conferences, as well as having representatives at most of the other State's Grand Assemblies.

The above paragraph is a not-too-subtle reminder that a number of other Grand Jurisdictions in the Northeast have openly discussed withdrawing from the General Grand Council. The same reasons are heard in these Grand Assemblies: what is the advantage of belonging to the General Grand? At the local level, the individual Companion has no idea as to what is happening at the General Grand level. He does know about the Cryptic Masons' charities (and I use the plural here since New York, for example, supports its own charity, Parkinson's disease research). I alert the General Grand elected officers that the withdrawal from the General Grand is a serious problem that must be addressed with thought and publicly. A plaque, lapel pin and thanks are not adequate public relations actions.

Over the three years I visited all but Pennsylvania as the Regional Deputy. Unfortunately, in every instance, Pennsylvania's Grand Assembly conflicted with another Masonic function that I was obligated to attend. In many instances I attended the Grand Assembly every year.

Two major topics were on my Agenda at every visit: The Cryptic Mason's Medical Research Program and York Rite Unity. Clearly CMMR is a topic that is well understood by most Companions throughout the Region. To this end I was fortunate to have Dr. Marsh, the Director of Research at Indiana University, as my keynote speaker at the Northeast Conference in 2004 at which there were more than one hundred and eighty attendees. This topic has done more to put Cryptic Masons 'on the map'. The General Grand Council must capitalize on this fact and do everything to expand on the public relations that the CMMRF has engendered.

The most significant fact found in the Northeast is the closeness amongst all of the Grand Assemblies and their Companions. It is not unusual to find representatives of all of the states seated in the Grand Assembly. Further proof of this is the personal relationships that have been formed in this Region throughout the years. I compliment my predecessors for creating this atmosphere of friendship everywhere I traveled and can report that I have been treated with the same warm camaraderie. Everywhere I went it was wonderful to see how my wife was included in these warm and personal associations and we consider ourselves to be very fortunate.

As noted at the beginning of this report, not all Grand Assemblies are strong, and I will discuss those Assemblies with my successor. In general, it is not a lack of leadership that is the cause for the status of these Grand Jurisdictions; rather it is, in my opinion, the fact that the Companions within have over-obligated themselves to other Masonic organizations. I do not believe there is an easy solution to this dilemma but it is something that must be recognized and not by just the General Council but also by other Masonic entities.

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Another highlight of my triennial was the very successful Northeast Conference that I chaired in September, 2004. It was attended by an exceptional number of attendees and their ladies. At each of the Conferences over the three-year period, I had developed an agenda that included discussions on Leadership, The Cryptic Mason's Medical Research Foundation, Cryptic Mason's Ritual, Planning, Membership and other pertinent topics. A personal evaluation of these Cryptic Mason's Sessions suggests that 'breakout' time permitted some serious as well as humorous moments throughout the day. The fact that both of these occurred causes me to be pleased with the results of my planning.

One other very positive comment can be made: outside of the Cryptic Mason's Fraternity, I was recognized as the Regional Deputy at many other Masonic functions. Again, this very flattering action can be attributed to the relationships that had been established throughout the Northeast Region. I am sure that the same warm friendship will be extended to my successor.

York Rite unity has been the theme of all three York Rite bodies. I cannot state, unequivocally that this exists throughout the Northeast. In some jurisdictions it works well, such as Maine, New Hampshire, Delaware and Connecticut. A close working relationship is very evident. I encourage the incoming Grand elected officers to continue this program otherwise the concept of unity will disappear.

Perhaps it should be emphasized that before a Mason can become a Cryptic Mason he must be a Chapter member; and before he can become a Knight Templar (where appropriate), the Companion must, as a minimum, be a member of a Chapter. Therefore, why isn't the General Grand Council of Cryptic Masons emphasizing membership in a Chapter, together with that of its own Body?

In conclusion, I want to thank all the Companions of the Northeast, and their Ladies, for the kindness and hospitality extended to me and my Lady Victoria on every occasion. It has been fun and we look forward to many more years of close association with the many friends we made.

REPORT OF THE EAST CENTRAL REGIONAL DEPUTY KERRY SLUSS

I was pleased to make the following visitations.

East Central Conference - March 7 & 8, 2003.

The Grand Council of Illinois hosted approximately 60 Companions and their ladies from Kentucky, Indiana, Michigan, and Wisconsin at the Hawthorne Suites in Champaign, Illinois.

REPORT OF THE CRYPTIC MASONS MEDICAL RESEARCH FOUNDATION **Marion K. Crum, Executive Secretary**

To the Members of the General Grand Council International:

I am indebted to Barbara Reynolds, Chief Administrator for Dr. Keith March, who is the director of the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine for the first part of this report.

I. CRTI

Plans for the Cardiovascular Research and Translational Institute (CRTI) are still viable, however, with the School of Medicine's budget deficit, plans for new construction on the campus are temporarily on hold.

The Dean reports that the budget deficit is due in large part to the following:

- The cut in State funding to Indiana University which in part was passed on to the School of Medicine

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- Tighter reins on grant monies, particularly those from the NIH, which in turn reduces the amount of “indirect” costs that the School of Medicine receives from these grants.

Dr. March continues to be very focused on the translational component of the research efforts of the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine (ICVBM). There is still great need for an accelerator facility that can expedite spin-offs of the most promising discoveries to benefit patients as quickly as possible. It is his hope that this facility would be located in close proximity to investigators’ laboratories so that it would ensure synergy between the scientists who have made discoveries in the lab and the businessmen who can propel the discovery to commercialization and eventually patient benefit.

To move the translational research agenda forward, Dr. March hired a patent liaison professional who was charged with visiting each of the scientists’ labs within the ICVBM. Two Center members, Drs. Merv Yoder and David Ingram, both neonatologists, shared their early indications of having discovered some very interesting and potentially important cells in blood obtained from umbilical cords which are readily available each time a baby is born. Provisional patents were filed about the therapeutic uses of these cells, with particular emphasis on the treatment of heart and blood vessel diseases. Based on continuing findings about the potential of these cells to benefit patients, a start-up biotechnology company was formed and emerged in February 2005 with the name EndGenitor (referring to the Endothelial Progenitor blood vessel cells that are found in abundance in umbilical cord blood).

II. Perclose

The School of Medicine continues to receive royalties from Perclose, the technology for the suture-mediated closure device used to close the femoral artery following a heart catheterization. Currently royalty revenue is remaining constant, but it anticipated that it will wane over the next few years as similar devices are introduced in the marketplace that will accomplish the same result, ie various types of plugs that can be inserted to close the hole after removal of the catheter.

III. AEDs

The defibrillators that have been recalled are devices actually implanted in the patient not the Automatic External Defibrillators (AEDs) seen in public facilities that can be used to administer an external shock to get a person’s heart beating again.

IV. New Recruit and Stem Cell Therapeutics

Dr. Michael Murphy, a vascular surgeon, recently recruited from Duke University, arrived on the School of Medicine campus this spring after serving a tour of duty with the National Guard as a surgeon in Iraq. This is what Dr. Murphy says about why he came to Indianapolis from Duke:

“I was a research fellow at Duke and was developing my laboratory and clinical interests in stem cell biology and vascular disease. I routinely reviewed papers on vascular progenitor cells and came across several papers from Keith March’s lab. I found

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his research in the biology of bone marrow progenitor cells was much further advanced than any American lab and on a par with the work being published by the Germans and Japanese. Furthermore I read several of his papers on the adipose stromal cell, a cell source that no other laboratory had really focused on at that time, and was impressed that he had already recognized the potential limitations of using bone marrow cells and was now examining the therapeutic potential of another cell source. What I found most interesting was the reference to the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine in each paper. The image that I had was a conglomeration of scientists working together with a common focus of interest, something that did not exist at Duke and was desperately needed.”

(Note that the CMMRF provided the funding to make the ICVBM possible thus enabling us to attract top-notch researchers from around the country).

Dr. Murphy is currently enrolling patients in the only FDA approved clinical trial that uses a patient's own stem cells derived from bone marrow to treat peripheral vascular disease. He has enrolled two patients with a goal of getting a total of ten enrolled for this initial safety phase I study. Once completed this safety phase will allow expansion in multiple directions such as altering the route of delivery of the cells (intra-arterial injection) and hopefully make the cells perform better with genetic engineering and using other stem cell sources such as the adipose (fat tissue) derived cells that Dr. March's lab is working with. The goal is to get approval to use these cells in the heart to help treat muscle damaged by disease or heart attack. End of Barbara's report.

I would like to clear up a misunderstanding concerning the PerClose (Closer Devise) that Dr. March Patented. It has never belongs to the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Fndn. It belongs to Indiana University School of Medicine. Dr. March has had the benefit of much of the proceeds to run our Center because he had the idea for the Closer. I.U. could not manufacture the devise, therefore Guidance Corp. manufactured and distributed it and pays I.U. School of Medicine Royalties for it. Thousands of them have been sold; however, sales have slowed down some because other manufactures have cloned it and have their product on the Market.

Cryptic Masons has enabled the School of Medicine to establish the Indiana Center for Vascular Biology and Medicine through the endowment of the Chair for one million dollars. There are several advantages for having a Center. I will name a few below.

- It gives our Center International recognition.
- It acts as a magnet to attract grants from both Federal & Non-Masonic sources to the tune of four and one half million dollars thus far.
- Pharmaceutical and Medical equipment manufacturers are more interested in investing in ideas developed in a Center.
- Students are applying for Grants from the Center to study and develop projects that furnish valuable information to Dr. March.
- The Dean of the School of Medicine has placed a higher priority on our research being done there. e.g. Allocating more space as we have out grown the wing of the building that we are now in.

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- It is attracting highly motivated and intelligent researchers from other Universities. Dr. Michael Murphy has recently been hired from Duke University. Dr. Murphy has been approved to do research on humans. This is a first for us as we have finally made a transition from animals to humans.

There are several projects going on at the Center at the present time; however, the one that is really on the cutting edge is using bone marrow stem cells from the patient to their legs in an attempt to grow blood vessels to supply blood to the feet. If this is successful as we think it will be, it should keep many people from having to suffer through amputations. Dr. March is putting the finishing touches on providing the safety material to FDA to get approval to use Stem Cells derived from fat tissue. This will be less painful as the stem cells can be taken from the patient and re-implanted in their legs in less than an hour. Using the patient's own stem cells should preclude rejection problems.

Treating peripheral artery disease is an important first target for these cells. Efforts with this treatment will help determine how to deliver cells to the heart to treat damaged heart cells.

A brief summary of our financial accomplishments is in order as many people are becoming more interested in this aspect of our foundation.

When I was appointed the secretary of the General Grand Council Benevolent Foundation, which subsequently became the Cryptic Masons Medical Research Foundation. We started tracking donations on the computer. We have taken in \$3,064,412.50 as of July 12, 2005 and we now have \$2,138,323.59 in financial assets. We have given \$1,884,000.00 toward research in vascular diseases. We have \$926,089.00 less money than we have taken in from contributions.

Endowment Fund: \$1,500,000.00 has been placed in an endowment fund and the principle is not to be spent.

General Fund: All operating expenses are paid from the income of investments.

The Annual Grant of \$100,000.00 to our research lab is paid from annual donations as it comes in or when something matures. This is done in 25 or 50 thousand dollar increments to prevent cashing in our investments. There has been some stock that was transferred to our investment company, which is not included as donations but they are shown in the current financial asset figure.

Endowed Chair: The Endowed chair earned \$ 134,919.78 for 2003-2004 and \$ 130,382.17 for 2004-2005 and the Non-invade-able Endowment Fund as of June 30, 2005 was \$ 1,045,712.76. Dr. March withdrew \$ 83,438.19 in 2004 and \$ 149,559.33 in 2005 from the fund. This added to our grant was just short of one quarter million dollars for 2005. The above money is from Cryptic Masons and does not include money from Non-Masonic sources.

Financial reports will be made available to any contributing Cryptic Mason upon request.

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Coins: Donations from the Coins year 2005 is \$4,275.00. Total to date is \$37,165.00.

Our office is always happy to furnish any report to contributing Cryptic Mason regarding research or finances upon request. A seminar is scheduled for August 11, 2006 at the Indiana School of Medicine in Indianapolis. Mark this on your calendar.

I strongly encourage that each jurisdiction provide this information, which is already in its possession, in electronic form. No other matters have been referred to this Committee.

Recommendations:

You will notice that this is not a balanced budget caused by two factors, namely the loss of 14% of the General Grand Council's membership this triennial, which reduces the per capita income and the low interest received on the invested funds.

The authorized Officers should reinvest the General Grand Council funds to receive maximum returns on the invested funds.

Because of the large loss of members the General Grand Council Officers should explore fund raising options to supplement the income from per capita and investment income.

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The General Grand Council is interested in developing income producing programs that will not only provide the funds necessary to balance the budget, but also to provide the funds necessary to provide services to the Constituent Grand Councils, and ultimately to provide the funds necessary to endow the Grand Councils for the future payment of per capita assessments.

We have resolved that certain financial programs made available to our members could provide additional income to the General Grand Council. The programs could include investments, mortgage loans, and credit cards, where the provider of such services would share in the income received and would pay a referral fee to us.

No specific plan is being recommended at this time, however your elected General Grand Council Officers need to be empowered to research and implement such programs. In every case, the General Grand Councils and the Constituent Grand Councils will not be at risk for such programs, but the individual members wishes to participate will ultimately generate income for the Cryptic Rite.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Nominations were then opened for the office of Right Puissant General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work.

M.I. Companion Kenney L. Lenfestey, Most Illustrious Grand Master of Michigan placed in nomination the name of M.I. Companion George C. Sellars of Michigan for the office of Right Puissant General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work.

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MPGGM Anderson asked three times for further nominations. There being no further nominations, MPGGM Anderson declared Companion Sellars elected by acclamation.

MPGGM Anderson then opened nominations for the office of Right Puissant General Grand Treasurer.

M.I. Companion Jerry Townsend (MI) suggested the name of Kenneth Chandler (MI). R.P. Companion Melburn Barnes (KS) seconded the nomination

R.P. Companion H. Edward Barr (CA) suggested the name of James G. Baum (CA) M.I. Companion John Bower (NV) seconded the nomination.

REPORT OF THE JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE ORVILLE E. WESSELER

M.P. Companion Wesseler (KS) presented the following amendments to the General Council Constitution as follows.

PROPOSAL # 1 TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL OF CRYPTIC MASONS INTERNATIONAL

Amend ARTICLE I, Section 12 to read:

ARTICLE I, Section 12.

ANNUAL DUES. Each Grand Council constituent of this General Grand Council shall pay the General Grand Recorder annually, thirty-five cents for each Royal and Select Master in good standing on its rolls, except for those whose dues have been remitted or those who have purchased Life Memberships in the General Grand Council.

Add ARTICLE I, Section 17.

ARTICLE I, Section 17.

LIFE MEMBERSHIP.

- (a) Any Royal and Select Master, in good standing of a constituent Grand Council, may purchase a Life Membership in the General Grand Council by paying a sum of \$10.00 (Ten Dollars) to the Grand Recorder of his Grand Council who will then pay that amount to the General Grand Recorder.

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- (b) The Life Membership fees will be invested in a perpetual fund with the prevailing rate of interest being for general revenue for the General Grand Council but never to exceed 5% (five percent). Any interest earned in excess of the 5% will be returned to the corpus account. At 5%, this will give the General Grand Council \$.50 (fifty cents) per life member and relieve the constituent Grand Council from the \$.35 per year for each of its Life Members.
- (c) The Royal and Select Masters with Life Membership will be kept separate from the Royal and Select Masters without Life Membership.
- (d) Cryptic Masons from jurisdictions, not subordinate to the General Grand Council, may purchase Life Membership at large for \$10.00. This membership carries no special preferences nor a vote at the General Grand Assembly.
- (e) Each new life member will receive a special membership certificate designating his status with the General Grand Council.
- (f) Each constituent Grand Council may or may not adopt this Life Membership proposal.
- (g) If a Life Member transfers to another Grand Council Jurisdiction, he may take his Life Membership with him and the Grand Recorder of Jurisdiction to which he has transferred will inform the General Grand Recorder of the transfer and not pay the \$0.35 per year for this Life Member.
- (h) If a Life Member is a Plural Member in his Jurisdiction, or Dual Member in another Grand Council Jurisdiction, his Life Membership is only good in the Council where he was a member when it was purchased. He may or may not purchase Life Memberships in all Councils where he is a member. However, the Grand Councils, to which he belongs, will pay \$0.35 to the General Grand Recorder for each council where he doesn't hold a Life Membership.
- (i) Holders of life membership certificates are subject to all the laws, rules and regulations as provided in the code of any Grand Council Cryptic Masons or Royal and Select Masters and loss of membership by suspension or expulsion shall automatically abrogate his life membership and any claim to any portion of any such fees paid for such life membership.

Any Council or individual may purchase a Memorial Life membership in the name of a deceased Companion for the sum of \$10.00 provided that the Companion, in whose name the certificate is to be issued, was in good standing in a legally constituted Council at the time of his demise. A special membership certificate designating the Memorial Life

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membership for the deceased and the purchaser may be sent to the purchaser or the family of the deceased at the request of the purchaser.

REASONING.

- 1) This Life Membership gives the General Grand Council perpetual income even after the death of the Life Membership holder.
- 2) It relieves the constituent Grand Council of the \$0.35 membership fee that can be added to its General Fund.
- 3) It is suggested that each constituent Grand Council raise the fee in its subordinate Councils by \$10.00 and purchase a Life Membership for each new Royal and Select Master.
- 4) If a constituent Grand Council has extra funds that can be invested, the interest income could be used to purchase Life Memberships for its youngest members.
- 5) These are only suggestions. There are many ways money can be raised to purchase Life Memberships for each Royal and Select Master.

PROPOSAL # 2 **TO AMEND THE CONSTITUTION OF THE** **GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL OF CRYPTIC MASONS INTERNATIONAL**

WHEREAS – Paragraph (b), Section 2, Article 1 lists the voting members of General Grand Council as all Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters and Grand Principal Conductors of the Work of Constituent Grand Councils or their Proxies and does not include the Grand Recorder:

BE IT RESOLVED – following the title word “Work”, a comma be inserted followed with “and sitting Grand Recorders”.

Paragraph (b) would then read as follows; “All Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters, Grand Principal Conductors of the Work, and sitting Grand Recorders of Constituent Grand Councils or their proxies. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.)

RATIONALE –

As this change is being prepared, from the office of the General Grand Recorder, the latest list of Grand Recorders among the General Grand Council Membership shows that

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barely 1/3 of the Grand Recorders are M.I.P.G.M. I am sure that no one will deny that a Grand Recorder does the lion's share of work for a Grand Council and often he is the adhesive that holds a Grand Council together.

Another reason for this change is that in my experience as General Grand Master, in order to get the quality of Companions to chair several of the Triennial Committees for me, I appointed Grand Recorders that had no vote in the Triennial. Yet they served with distinction.

The attendance at our Triennial has been declining for several years. Expanding our voting membership ought to help slow this condition.

Be it Resolved to amend Section 12 by adding the following sentence at the end of the current Article: **“No Grand Council shall pay the annual assessment per member on more than Ten Thousand Members in any given year.”**

If amended the Article will read:

SECTION 12. ANNUAL DUES. Each Grand Council constituent of this General Grand Council shall pay the General Grand Recorder annually, thirty-five (35) cents for each Royal and Select Master in good standing on its rolls, except for those whose dues have been remitted. No Grand Council shall pay the annual assessment per member on more than Ten Thousand Members in any given year.

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GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL AWARDS

General Grand Council Medal of Honor:

One medal awarded each Triennium to an outstanding Cryptic Mason for service to Masonry and who is well known in the Arts, Science, Business, Religion or Government. Nominations shall be made to the General Grand Masters and selection approved by the elective officers.

Mordhurst Medal:

A medal awarded to the Grand Recorder of a Grand Council who has served 15 years or more, and not to be awarded prior to the date of qualification.

Columbian Medal:

A medal awarded to an outstanding Cryptic Mason for service to Masonry. One medal for each of the seven Regions, and not more than three medals at-large per Triennium. Nominations made to the Regional Deputies and selection by the elective officers.

Cryptic Masons of the Year Medal and Lapel Pin:

One medal each year presented to a Cryptic Mason by the General Grand Council to a man selected by each Grand Council for outstanding service to Cryptic Masonry. Each Grand Council and each subordinate Council will select its own Cryptic Mason of the Year according to the following rules and regulations:

- A. Only one medal may be awarded annually to a Cryptic Mason in each affiliated Grand Council.
- B. Only one medal may be awarded triennially to a Cryptic Mason in each Subordinate council of the General Grand Council.
- C. Each Grand Council and each subordinate Council shall determine its own method of selecting the Cryptic Mason of the Year in its jurisdiction.
- D. No posthumous awards shall be made.
- E. The award shall be made only for exceptional and meritorious service to Cryptic Masonry above and beyond the call of duty. No Past or Present Grand Master, or any advancing line officer of a Grand Council shall be eligible for this award, however, this restriction shall apply only to the Cryptic Mason of the Year Award, and not to the Adult Leadership Award.
- F. The General Grand Recorder shall be given the name of the selected Cryptic Mason to be engraved upon the medal at least thirty days prior to the date it is to be awarded. Subordinate Councils shall give the name of the selected Cryptic Mason to be engraved upon the medal at least six months prior to the next Triennial Assembly.
- G. The General Grand Recorder shall cause the name of the honoree to be engraved upon the medal and forwarded to the Grand Recorder or Recorder, if to a subordinate Council, at the earliest time following receipt of the name.

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Adult Leadership Award and Lapel Pin:

One medal presented annually in each Jurisdiction affiliated with General Grand Council to a nominee who shall be a leader in one of the youth organizations recognized by the General Grand Council, namely: Order of DeMolay, Order of Rainbow for Girls or Order of Job's Daughters.

- A. Only one medal may be awarded annually in each Grand Council.
- B. Only one medal may be awarded triennially in each Subordinate council of the General Grand Council.
- C. Each Grand Council and each subordinate Council shall determine its own method of selecting the Nominee in its jurisdiction.
- D. No posthumous awards shall be made.
- E. The award shall be made only for exceptional and meritorious service above and beyond the call of duty.
- F. The General Grand Recorder shall be given the name of the selected Nominee to be engraved upon the medal at least thirty days prior to the date it is to be awarded. Subordinate Councils shall give the name of the selected Nominee to be engraved upon the medal at least six months prior to the next Triennial Assembly.
- G. The General Grand Recorder shall cause the name of the honoree to be engraved upon the medal and forwarded to the Grand Recorder or Recorder, if to a subordinate Council, at the earliest time following receipt of the name.

Grand Master's Lapel Pin:

Each retiring Grand Master shall be presented a Lapel Pin, and Life Membership Card which designates him as a permanent member of the General Grand Council.

10% Gain Certificate:

For a Council gaining 10% or more in membership in one year. A request should be sent to the General Grand Recorder, and will be mailed to each state before their Annual Assembly. A General Grand Officer may be asked to make the presentation.

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THE CONSTITUTION
of the
GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL
CRYPTIC MASONS INTERNATIONAL
As Revised to September 14, 1993

ARTICLE I GENERAL GRAND COUNCIL STRUCTURE

SECTION 1. NAME. This body shall be known as the General Grand Council, Cryptic Masons International.

SECTION 2. MEMBERS. The members of the General Grand Council are:

- (a) All properly affiliated Past Grand Master of Constituent Grand Council.
- (b) All Grand Masters, Deputy Grand Masters, Grand Principal Conductors of the Work of Constituent Grand Councils or their Proxies. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.)
- (c) The first three officers of each subordinate council under the jurisdiction of this General Grand Council, or their proxies. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Subordinate Council.)
- (d) Special Representatives of the General Grand Master.

SECTION 3. CONDUCT OF ASSEMBLIES. Assemblies are conducted as follows:

- (a) **MAJORITY VOTE.** At Triennial Assemblies all questions are to be determined by a majority vote unless otherwise provided. The presiding officer shall have no vote, except in case of a tie.
- (b) **MEMBER VOTE.** Each member shall be entitled to one vote as such; and one vote for each proxy held except as specified below. (A proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.)
- (c) **SUBORDINATE COUNCIL VOTE.** Representatives from a Subordinate Council shall jointly be entitled to one vote, the majority of such representatives present determining how the vote shall be cast.
- (d) **GENERAL GRAND OFFICERS VOTE.** All General Grand Council Officers, as specified in Article 1, Section 4 shall be entitled to one vote as such; and one vote for each proxy held. (A

proxy, at the time of his service, must be a member of the same Constituent Grand Council.

- (e) **GRAND MASTERS VOTE.** Those Grand Masters who serve more than one year as Grand Masters are entitled to one vote for each full year served.

SECTION 4. OFFICERS. The officers of this General Grand Council shall be:

who shall be a Past Grand Master of a Constituent Grand Council except for General Grand Treasurer, General Grand Recorder, General Grand Chaplain and any Foreign (outside the U.S.A.) Regional Deputy General Grand Master.

- (a) **ELECTIVE OFFICERS:** The General Grand Master, Deputy General Grand Master, General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, General Grand Treasurer and the General Grand Recorder shall be elected by ballot at each Triennial Assembly.
- (b) **APPOINTIVE OFFICERS:** The Regional Deputy Grand Masters, General Grand Chaplain, General Grand Captain of the Guard, General Grand Conductor of the Council, General Grand Marshal, General Grand Steward and the General Grand Sentinel shall be appointed by the General Grand Master to serve for a term of three (3) years and no companion serving in any of these offices, except the General Grand Chaplain and any Foreign (outside the U.S.A.) Regional Deputy General Grand Master shall be eligible to succeed himself or to be appointed to another office during the Triennium succeeding the expiration of his term in office. However any appointive officer may be elected to a higher office in this General Grand Council at anytime.
- (c) **INSTALLATION.** The elected and appointed officers of this General Grand Council shall be installed at each Triennial Assembly, or as soon thereafter as is practicable.

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- (d) **VACANCY IN OFFICE.** Provided, however, should the office of General Grand Master be vacated by death, permanent disability, or other causes, the Deputy General Grand Master and the General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work shall in the order named, be installed and succeed to the office, its title and prerogatives.
- (e) **DISABILITY.** Provided further, that the question of permanent disability or other causes as herein used shall be determined by the Committee on Cryptic Jurisprudence.
- (f) **PRECEDENCE OF RANK.** Precedence of Rank shall be:
 - Most Puissant General Grand Master
 - Right Puissant Deputy General Grand Master
 - Right Puissant General Grand Conductor of the Work
 - Right Puissant General Grand Treasurer
 - Right Puissant General Grand Recorder
 - Right Puissant Regional Deputy General Grand Masters all of equal status
 - Right Puissant General Grand Chaplain
 - Right Puissant General Grand Captain of the Guard
 - Right Puissant General Grand Conductor of the Council
 - Right Puissant General Grand Marshal
 - Right Puissant General Grand Steward
 - Right Puissant General Grand Sentinel

SECTION 5. STATED ASSEMBLIES. The Stated Assemblies of this General Grand Council shall be held Triennially, at such date and place as it shall determined; provided that if in the opinion of the General Grant] Master, or in case of his inability, then the senior General Grand Officer, there shall be danger to life or health from sickness or other local cause, by any meeting being held at the time or place appointed, he may change such meeting to some other time and place; and in the event of such change being made he shall immediately notify the General Grand Recorder thereof, who shall forthwith notify the other officers and members in such manner as he may deem best calculated to effect the desired object.

SECTION 6. SPECIAL ASSEMBLIES. The General Grand Master and the Deputy General Grand Master shall have authority to call a Special Assembly of the General Grand Council whenever they consider it expedient or necessary, and it shall be their duty to do so when properly requested by a majority of the Grand Councils, of which three (3) months notice shall be given of the time and place of the special meetings. The purpose of the meeting shall be stated in the call and no business other than that for which it is called shall be transacted.

SECTION 7. QUORUM. A quorum of this General Grand Council shall consist of seven (7) Grand Councils.

SECTION 8. JURISDICTION. The General Grand Council shall watch over and protect the interests of Cryptic Masonry in the States, Districts or Territories which recognize its jurisdiction and where there is no Grand Council regularly established; and shall settle all difficulties which may arise and be referred to it, and shall give such advice and instructions as may seem most conducive to the peace, advancement and perpetuation of Cryptic Mason in its original integrity.

SECTION 9. POWERS AND DUTIES OF GENERAL GRAND MASTER.

- (a) **COUNCILS U.D.** The General Grand Master, or, in case of his inability to act, the Deputy General Grand Master, shall have the power to grant dispensations for new Subordinate Councils of Cryptic Masons in any State, District, or Territory where there is no Grand Council regularly established and working independently of any other Masonic Body; such dispensation in no case to extend beyond the time of the next Stated Assembly of this General Grand Council, but no new Subordinate Council shall be established by any State, District or Territory where there is a regular subordinate Council within a reasonable distance, without the consent of the Subordinate Council nearest the place where such new Subordinate Council is proposed to be located; and he shall immediately notify the General Grand Recorder of such dispensation, and make report of the same at the next Triennial Assembly of this General Grand Council; when the General Grand Council may grant said Subordinate Council a Charter.
- (b) **REGIONAL DEPUTY GENERAL GRAND MASTERS.** The General Grand Master, or in his inability to act, the Deputy General Grand Master, shall have the power and authority to appoint in each of the Regions into which the Constituent Grand Councils are divided, a Regional Deputy General Grand Master who shall be a Past Grand Master, to represent him and have such duties and exercise such special powers and authority as may be granted to him by the General Grand Master or the Deputy General Grand Master.
- (c) **SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVES.** The General Grand Master shall have the power and authority to appoint in each District, Territory, State or Country where no Grand Council exists but where councils subordinate to this General Grand Council have been Chartered or may hereafter be established or chartered a Special Representative who shall represent him and have such duties and exercise such special powers and authority as may be granted to him by the General Grand Master or the Deputy General Grand Master and such Special Representatives shall serve at the pleasure of the General Grand Master and not longer than three (3) years unless re-appointed by the succeeding General Grand Master or Deputy General Grand Master. Such Special Representatives, if

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present at any Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council shall be members of the same and entitled to one vote.

SECTION 10. FEES AND DUES OF SUBORDINATE COUNCILS.

- (a) **DISPENSATION AND PER CAPITA.** The fees for granting a dispensation shall be twenty-five dollars (\$25.00), and every Council holden by Dispensation, or Charter, from this body shall pay into the Treasury of the General Grand Council, the sum of one (1) dollar for each companion greeted therein, and fifty cents (\$0.50) annually for each member, until such time as a Grand Council shall be regularly established in that State, District or Territory in which such Council is located.
- (b) **FEES FOR CHARTER AND DEGREES.** The General Grand Recorder shall be paid by the petitioners five (5) dollars for his services in granting a charter. The fees in the several Councils under the immediate jurisdiction of this General Grand Council, for the Degrees of Royal Master and Select Master and the appendant degree of Super Excellent Master shall not be less than ten (10) dollars.

SECTION 11. GRAND COUNCIL FORMATION. Whenever there shall be three councils regularly constituted in any State, District or Territory, a Grand Council may be established as soon as convenience and propriety may dictate, provided the consent of the General Grand Master or the General Grand Council be first obtained.

SECTION 12. ANNUAL DUES. Each Grand Council constituent of this General Grand Council shall pay the General Grand Recorder annually, thirty-five (35) cents for each Royal and Select Master in good standing on its rolls, except for those whose dues have been remitted.

SECTION 13. ANNUAL RETURNS. The Grand Recorder of each Grand Council shall be required to transmit to the General Grand Recorder an official notice of the election of its Grand Officers within thirty (30) days thereafter, and also transmit to the General Grand Recorder two copies of their proceedings as soon as the same are printed.

SECTION 14. CHARTER OR DISPENSATION REQUIRED. Every Council of Cryptic Masons (or Council of Royal and Select Masters) must have a charter or dispensation from the General Grand Council, or from some Grand Council and no Council shall be deemed legal without such dispensation or charter; and Masonic communication, both public and private, is hereby interdicted and forbidden between any Council or any member of it, and any Council or Assembly that may be so illegally formed or holden or opened without such charter, or any person assumed to be received or greeted therein. Nothing in this section shall be construed to apply to the jurisdiction of Virginia or West Virginia.

SECTION 15. SOVEREIGNTY OF GRAND COUNCILS. Each Grand Council shall determine the legal status of the Cryptic Masons (or Royal and Select Masters) of their

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several jurisdictions, and shall have absolute authority over and control of, the Cryptic Rite within their several Grand Jurisdictions; including the form and substance of the rituals used in conferring, in their respective jurisdictions, the Cryptic Rite of Masonry, to wit; Royal Master, Select Master, together with the degree of Super Excellent Master.

SECTION 16. MILEAGE AND PER DIEM. All elective and appointive General Grand Council Officers and Past General Grand Master, together with the chairmen of all standing committees, shall receive twenty (20) cents per mile one way traveling by the shortest route and forty (40) dollars per day for each day consumed in traveling to and from and two days while in attendance at the Triennial Assemblies of this General Grand Council. Provided: The their expenses are not paid by any other Masonic General Grand Body for the same Period.

ARTICLE II SUBORDINATE COUNCILS

SECTION 1. OFFICERS. A Council of Cryptic Masons under immediate jurisdiction of this General Grand Council shall consist of the following officers: Illustrious Master, Deputy Master, Principal Conductor of the Work, Treasurer, Recorder, Captain of the Guard, Conductor of the Council, Marshal, Steward, Chaplain, Sentinel and as many other members as may be convenient for working together.

SECTION 2. ANNUAL RETURNS. Every Council under the immediate jurisdiction of this General Grand Council shall annually make a return to the General Grand Recorder of their name, number, location and time of stated meetings with a list of officers and members, degrees conferred, companions admitted, died, suspended or expelled in accordance with the form furnished from the office of the General Grand Recorder.

SECTION 3. UNDER DISPENSATION. Every Council under dispensation from this General Grand Council shall at the close of its period, return to the General Grand Recorder its dispensation and records.

SECTION 4. DEGREES. The degrees recognized by this General Grand Council are as follows and must be conferred only in the order named: ROYAL MASTER, SELECT MASTER, AND SUPER EXCELLENT MASTER.

ARTICLE III STANDING COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. APPOINTMENTS. The General Grand Master (elect), after installation, and before the close of the session, shall appoint the following committees, whose term shall extend and be analogous with the term of the General Grand Master, unless by him sooner removed by the appointment of his or their successors, viz:

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- (a) **FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS.** A committee of FINANCE AND ACCOUNTS, consisting of as many members as in the judgment of the General Grand Master shall be necessary, whose duty it shall be to examine and pass upon all business of a financial nature; to examine the books and accounts of the General Grand Treasurer and the General Grand Recorder, and make a report thereof in writing, as early as may be, during the session of the General Grand Council and to perform such other duties as the General Grand Council may refer to them.
- (b) **CRYPTIC JURISPRUDENCE.** A committee on CRYPTIC JURISPRUDENCE, consisting of as many members as in the judgment of the General Grand Master, shall be necessary, whose duty shall be to examine all questions of Masonic law and jurisprudence, the status of membership, conflicts (if opinion, appeals and grievances, as existing or arising within the bodies constituting the membership of the General Grand Council, which may be referred to them for action or opinion, and such other duties as may be referred to them be the General Grand Master or presiding officer.
- (c) **CREDENTIALS AND REGISTRATION.** A committee on CREDENTIALS AND REGISTRATION, to consist of five (5) or more members, whose duty it shall be to register all delegates at the Triennial Assembly, check all credentials and report as soon as practicable after the opening of the Triennial Assembly, the number of delegates present and entitled to vote and to participate in the proceedings thereof.

ARTICLE IV SPECIAL COMMITTEES

SECTION 1. APPOINTMENTS. The General Grand Master may appoint such Special Committees as in his judgment would be to the best interest of this General Grand Council. The following committees are suggested: A committee on Publicity; A committee on Cryptic History and Promotion; A committee on Ritual and/or Work; A committee on Aims and Purposes; A committee on Charters and Dispensations; A committee on The Cryptic Room; A committee on Fraternal Dead; A committee on Topical Reference; A committee on York Rite Coordination; A committee on Visitors.

ARTICLE V INVESTMENTS AND FUNDS

SECTION 1. INVESTMENTS AND FUNDS.

- (a) **PERMANENT FUND.** There is hereby established a permanent fund, which shall consist of the bonds and cash on hand in a special account. As of September, 1984, this fund was \$50,000. The principal and any contribution to it shall be kept intact. This shall be considered the Permanent Fund and the

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earnings of this fund shall be transferred to the General Fund for the General expense of this General Grand Council.

- (b) **TRUSTEES.** The above fund shall be held in trust by the General Grand Treasurer. The General Grand Master, the Deputy General Grand Master and the General Grand Principal Conductor of the Work, shall be trustees of this fund. No funds shall be transferred from the Permanent Fund except by action of the General Grand Council, who may, in case of an emergency transfer to the General Fund such funds as may be deemed necessary for the well being of the General Grand Council.
- (c) **GENERAL FUND.** The General Fund shall consist of all moneys that are received by the General Grand Recorder and by him transmitted to the General Grand Treasurer and shall only be paid out by warrants drawn by the General Grand Recorder, and such warrants shall be countersigned by the General Grand Master. The General Fund shall be under the direction of the committee on Finance and Accounts of the General Grand Council, and they shall prepare a budget at each Triennial Assembly for the general expenses of the General Grand Council.

ARTICLE VI CHANGE OF CONSTITUTION

SECTION 1. How AMENDED. This Constitution may be amended at any Stated Assembly by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present as specified in Article 1, Section 2.

- (a) **How PROPOSED.** All amendments to this Constitution of the General Grand Council, of Cryptic Masons must be proposed in writing.
- (b) **CONTENTS.** They must contain such section or sub-section thereof which it is proposed to amend, in its entire form, as it is intended to be after it is amended.
- (c) **ADDITIONAL SECTIONS.** If desirable, such proposed amendments may be numbered as additional sections of sub-sections thereof.
- (d) **FILED WITH THE GENERAL GRAND RECORDER.** Such proposed amendments shall be forwarded to the General Grand Recorder at least six (6) months prior to the Triennial Assembly of the General Grand Council.
- (e) **GENERAL GRAND RECORDER DUTY.** The General Grand Recorder shall five (5) months prior to the date of the next Triennial Assembly of this General Grand Council, mail to each of the General Grand Officers, Past Grand Masters, Grand Recorders and Grand Masters of each Constituent Grand Council a copy of all proposed amendments which shall have been filed with him.
- (f) **JURISPRUDENCE COMMITTEE.** The Jurisprudence Committee shall carefully consider all such proposed amendments and report thereon to the General Grand

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Council at its next Triennial Assemble and no action shall be taken thereon by the General Grand Council until such report shall have been made.

(f) EFFECTIVE DATES. Unless other-wise provided by the General Grand Council, all amendments presented shall take effect immediately after adoption.

SECTION 2. NON-MEMBER GRAND COUNCIL. Nothing contained in this Constitution shall be constructed to derogate from the right or authority of any Grand Council which may not determine to become a constituent member of this General Grand Council.

SECTION 3. MEMBER GRAND COUNCIL. Any Grand Council may become a member of this General Grand Council whenever it shall ratify and accept this Constitution. Upon such acceptance and ratification the Grand Recorder shall immediately notify the General Grand Recorder.

SECTION 4. GRAND COUNCIL CONSTITUENCY. Every Grand Council shall be sovereign in its own jurisdiction, and may withdraw its constituency from this General Grand Council; Provided, always, that before such withdrawal shall be effective in the General Grand Council, a certified copy of the resolution of withdrawal so adopted by the constituent Grand Council shall be filed with the General Grand Recorder, which resolution shall be signed and certified by the Grand Master and Grand Recorder of the Grand Council so withdrawing; and provided further that if, at the time of the withdrawal of any Grand Council, any companion of the Grand Council so withdrawing, shall at the time of such withdrawal be an officer of or hold a membership on a committee of this General Grand Council, such office or committeemanship shall become vacant; and provided further, that all indebtedness to this General Grand Council shall have been paid.

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
